A big thank you to all who have donated cancelled stamps and box tops for education. We've been asked not to save the forever flag stamps. however all others are welcome.

The box tops will be sent to Red Bird Mission in Kentucky and the stamps will be sent to benefit Right Sharing of World Resources, a Quaker affiliated organization that loans money to small groups of women to start micro businesses that make such a huge difference in their lives. Our recycling can has a big impact on our world.



Another way you can recycle is to save the pop tabs on cans for Ronald McDonald House. The Indianapolis Ronald McDonald House has 46 rooms for parents of children under 21 who are in the hospital and 6 apts. for families of transplant patients. The charge for a room is \$10.00 per night for those who can afford it, but no one is turned away for lack of funds. It takes 1,000 pop tabs to make a pound and they receive 40-50 cents per pound. Last year approximately \$80,000 was received from pop tabs donated. With very little effort we can make a big difference in other's lives. Thank you for helping.

2010

Bob Stubbs from Hinkle Creek Friends meeting gave the opening sermon on Philippians 4:4 (Rejoice in the Lord always) on Friday morning. This set the whole spirit of the meeting. There seemed to be generally good will throughout the sessions.

The Executive Board gave their report. The report stated that "Jesus Christ is our Lord and Savior" They also asked for approval: We recognize that we have differences, and we recommend staying together as a Yearly Meeting".

This statement was approved along with the complete report. A multigenerational program was held by the Youth Cabinet. This was one of the highlights of the session. Our youth are well grounded in the Christian Faith.

On Saturday morning Jason Grant from New London and West Middleton Friends gave the opening sermon. It was based on Philippians 4:5 (Let your gentleness be known to everyone).

The various treasurers gave their reports. There was much discussion on the budget. It was sent back to committee to make the necessary changes that were suggested.

In the afternoon various workshops were held. They consisted of Peace and Social Concerns (Caring for our Political Systems and our Earth), CM&E (Treasurer's Workshop), Outreach (What do All the Letters Mean), MD&N (Technology and Worship), Youth (Generational Differences).

Everyone attended a workshop on WYM Faith and Practice. We were broken into small groups and were given several questions to discuss.

The USFW Tea and the Men's Banquet were held on Saturday evening. After the meals Pat Shrock gave a talk on missions. Pat has been a missionary at Friends Theological College and also in Beliese.

Sunday was devoted to worship. Della Stanley Green led the worship service. It was based on Philippians 4:6 (Do not worry). She stated that we come to a point where we should quit striving and turn the problem over to God.

Marilyn Bell from Hortonville Friends conducted the memorial service honoring those who joined the Lord this past year. There were six from Carmel.

A recording service was held to introduce the pastors who had completed the recording process. Paul and Ramona Trover were recorded as Friends Pastors. They are pastors at Newport Friends in Dana, Indiana.

The Quaker Lecture was presented by Terry Wallace the author of *A Sincere and Constant Love*. This is an introduction to the work of Margaret Fell. He spoke on the love and power of God. He stated that Friends have only one testimony and that is (Faith in our Lord and unity in the Body of Christ).

On Monday, the sermon was led by Jeff Wolf from Bloomingdale Friends. His subject was Philippians 4:7 (The peace of God will guard your hearts and minds in Jesus Christ our Lord).

Earlham College and Indiana Yearly Meeting gave a report and asked WYM to change the by-laws of Earlham College so that Indiana Yearly Meeting would relinquish their responsibilities to Earlham and just maintain a ministry presence. This is due to Indiana Yearly Meeting having issues with the liberal bent of Earlham. This passed.
